Building Institutional Resilience through Participatory Quality Assurance

Abstract (150 words max.)

The Continuous Development Cycle (CDC) is a stakeholder-driven quality enhancement model developed within the PROFFORMANCE initiative to support teaching performance development in higher education. Rooted in enhancement-led QA, participatory feedback culture and organisational learning theory, the CDC reflects ESG 2015 principles, particularly stakeholder involvement, autonomy and continuous improvement. The cycle consists of four stages: goal setting, assessment, support and follow-up. It incorporates feedback from self, peers and students, forming a three-dimensional evidence base that fosters constructive dialogue and inclusive decision-making. This poster visually presents the CDC model and its core components: a performance assessment tool, a good practice database and short courses. It illustrates how the CDC strengthens institutional resilience and supports international collaboration in teaching enhancement. The model will be applied in an international professional network, providing a transferable framework for inclusive, transparent and adaptive quality development.
