



Overview of the Profformance Assessment tool – based on Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is it and who is it for?

- PAT (Performance Assessment Tool) is a performance evaluation and support system for educators.
- Primary users include higher education institutions, academic staff, and international working groups.
- It complements existing QA and evaluation systems.
- **Free and voluntary**, funded by the European Commission and Hungary's Ministry of Innovation and Culture profformance.eu.

2. How to adopt it in institutions?

Institutions can start by:

1. Proposing PAT to decision-makers (Leaders, QA/teaching centres).
2. Exploring guides and demo videos.
3. Contacting the Tempus Public Foundation for support tool.profformance@tpf.hu.
4. Running a small pilot group.
5. Defining goals, conducting the survey, communicating results, and planning follow-up actions.
6. Cycling continuous improvement based on results.

3. Integration with existing systems

- No direct integrations yet (e.g., LMS, HR systems).
- PAT visualizes and compares self-, peer-, and student feedback, useful for both internal and international use.

4. Student surveys

- Teachers can invite students via a unique link from the SELF assessment form (no student registration needed).
- Surveys are **anonymous**; each IP can submit only once per questionnaire.

5. Network admin capabilities

- Admin roles include creating network structures, adding admins and teachers (individually or by bulk Excel import), creating tasks, and viewing aggregated & individual results post-survey.

6. Reporting and data export

- Results are graphically displayed at network/unit/teacher levels.
- Raw data export isn't currently available, but planned for next releases, along with filtering options.

7. Scientific foundation

- Developed by 20 experts from 10 countries, based on EHEA's ESG standards.
- Emphasizes continuous improvement and student-centered learning.

8. Engaging educators

- Educators are motivated by formative feedback, goal-setting, and development opportunities.
- A flexible approach allows focusing on specific themes instead of answering all 80 statements.
- Educational incentives (like recognition or workshops) are important .

9. Tool evolution

- Users cannot edit questions yet, but can choose thematic areas.
- In the planned new features, improvements include:
 - Enhanced user-friendliness, data export, navigation.
 - New statements linked to digitalization, internationalization, inclusion, sustainability .

10. Other FAQs

- Users can preview statements after registering and creating a task.
- Networks are private by default; access requires invitation by an admin .
