

- Commitment to quality, performance, competitiveness and internationalization
- Emphasis on teaching excellence and innovation
- Main strategic directions focus on developing studentcentred and flexible learning pathways, improving teaching quality, and fostering excellence across all study programmes aligning with the principles of the Tirana (2024) and Rome Communiqués (2020).

Challenges and Good Practices



- Uneven teacher training opportunities
- Recognition gap for teaching excellence
- Good practices: PROFFORMANCE+, Teacher Award, Learning Outcomes, Dropout indicator, KRE IKT Research Centre

Main Directions for Developing Teaching and Learning

- Reducing student dropout: a major objective, directly linked to the quality and effectiveness of teaching and learning support.
- Renewal of study content: aligning curricula with labour-market needs and strengthening professional and language competences.
- Strengthening STEM fields: increasing participation and graduation in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.
- Dual education and cooperation with VET: reinforcing the bridge between higher education and vocational training through strategic partnerships.
- Introduction of micro-credentials: fostering flexible, modular learning pathways and lifelong learning opportunities, supported by OECD cooperation projects.

Modernisation and internationalization of Higher Education

- The "University 2030" Programme
- E-learning and distance education: enhancing quality and accessibility, especially for master's students and professionals through online and blended formats.
- Integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI): institutions are encouraged to review study and examination regulations and include AI literacy in curricula.
- Modern teaching practices: promoting innovative, studentactive learning methods beyond traditional lectures and seminars to increase engagement and interactivity.

National Support and Assessment Systems (updated)



- Learning outcomes integrated in QA via national standards
 & accreditation
- Student feedback systematically collected; growing use in institutional enhancement
- Dropout rate tracked as an inclusion/SCL effectiveness indicator
- PROFFORMANCE benchmarking & NOR-CAM-inspired assessment support teacher development and multidimensional recognitionness.

- Continuous monitoring and improvement of teaching quality
- Potential integration into accreditation and funding frameworks
- Ongoing collaboration with regional and EU partners

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
