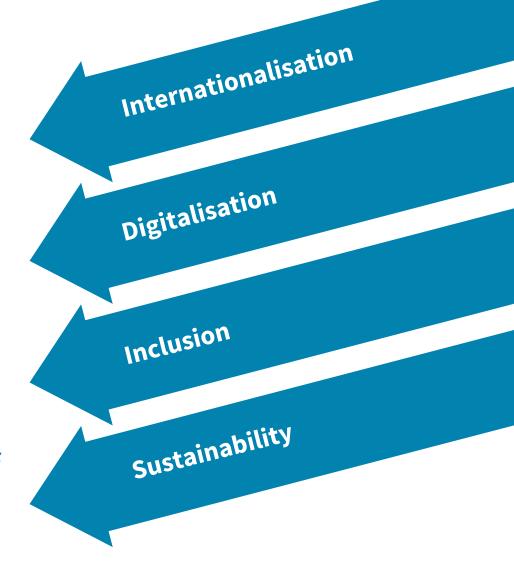




Strategy for Education Development 2030

Broad strategic framework with two measures for achieving the specific goals:

- Development of the HE Quality Monitoring and Evaluation Framework and the application of the obtained results in the HE policy formulation;
- Development and implementation of a **financing model** that encourages the quality of HE, efficiency and success of studies.



National context in teaching and learning practices in HE

- <u>Law on Higher Education</u> Defines governance, accreditation and quality assurance.
- Strategy for Education development by 2030 + Action Plan 2023-2026 Broad strategic framework, encompassing different aspects of HE, as relevance, quality, accessibility and digitalisation.
- <u>NEAQA</u> National Entity for Accreditation and QA in HE ensuring its compliance with internationally recognised standards for accreditation and quality assurance.
- <u>Digital Skills Strategy 2020–2024</u> includes specific measures for HE teachers and students in digital upskilling.
- <u>REdiS 2030</u> EU support to Reform of Education in Serbia in cooperation with the Ministry of Education. Project focuses on institutional capacity building, Evidence based policy making, QA mechanisms, Policy dialogue

Goals in four horizontal priority areas

Priority

Strategic goals and measures in HE

Digitalisation

Improving digital competencies in teachers and students; promote blended learning; improve infrastructure; integrate AI in curricula (Digital Strategy 2020-2024).

Internationalisation

Aligning HE QA with European/ international standards (NEAQA, ENQA, ESG); increasing mobility of students and staff; implementation of foreign language trainings (EMI); Attracting international students; recognition of qualifications; increase of international research activities. (NEAQA, Strategy for Education Development 2030).

Inclusion

Equitable access for everyone, especially vulnerable groups (Roma, students with disabilities), implementation of SDG goals like Recognition of prior learning; improvement of inclusive learning environments (<u>United Nations</u>).

Sustainability

SDES 2030 goals can be achieved through various approaches and by aligning education with sustainable development; ensure affordability and quality tertiary education; improve knowledge and skills for sustainable development (Strategy for Education Development, RSPP).





Challenges in achieving Strategic T&L goals in HE

- Digital infrastructure and professional capacity building in Teacher training in digital/ hybrid learning
- Teaching and learning still not fully embedded in curricula

Funding, language barriers limit mobilities

- Implementation and realization of the foreign language trainings for the teachers in the HE

HEIs: innovation, capacity builling of staff, research, internal QA

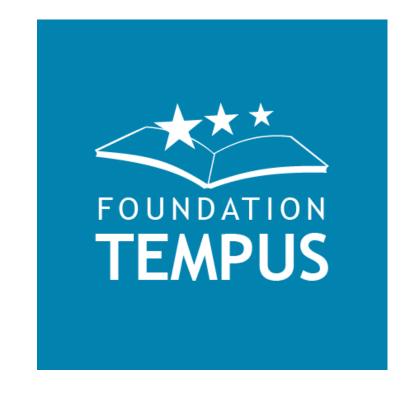
