

- Volunteer work in residential and nursing homes (Regional govt.)
- Market research for biodegradable gras straws from Uganda
- Health promotion and employer branding (Lebenshilfe)
- Fighting poverty through food donations logistics of food bank
- Diabetes prevention quality of care and disease management in Tyrol
- Fundraising strategies for different associations
- Customer satisfaction in mobile care



Technology + Tools

- Technical Tools, Learning Management System SAKAI
- Didactic tools
 - Course Book including Learning Goals, Content and Assignments per semester week
 - Clear rubrics for the assignments, detailed description
 - work on basis of learning goals
 - Flipped classroom, Slido, Kahoot
 - Agile Project Management Trello, MS Teams for collaboration
- Guidelines and teasing questions for accompanying reflection



Outputs / Outcome Statements practise partners

- Close connection to challenges of the practise

Lessons learnt

- Coordination of team of (around 20) lecturers
- Big effort special semester, can be organized only once in a BA-degree – a lot of energy needed
- Avoid repetitions of content or overlaps of assignments
- Timeline and sequence of the courses is essential
- Integration of student feedback for future cohorts
- Read reflections timely in order to react fast if necessary
- Stay in close contact with the student groups



Adaptability, transferability

- Approach can be easily transferred into other contexts, especially to other Higher Education Institutions
- Need to build up a network of external organizations to serve as practice partners
- Project ideas can also arise from alumni or students of higher cohorts.
