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Main topics



- the course is part of the graduate study program in History as an internal elective course of the teaching module
- financed by the University of Rijeka small grants for the inclusion in the YUFE (Young Universities for the Future of Europe) network from 2020
- implies an interdisciplinary approach to learning and teaching, combining skills and competencies acquired in the humanities with skills and competencies acquired in the computer sciences

Challenge / problem – objective



- EU Digital Education Action Plan (2021-2027) policy, Croatian Ministry of education National strategy (2020-2022) for education, Strategy of the University of Rijeka (2021-2025)
- the course introduces ways of transferring (medieval) history content by using interactive and interdisciplinary teaching methods and tools
- shows how history and culture are reflected in different areas today, primarily through modern literature, culture and popular culture
- facilitates the application of sources for creative teaching and more accessible transmission of teaching

Methodology of implementation



- seminars and exercises in computer classrooms
- designing a short project based on the selected topic and digital tool appropriate for the topic presentation
- interactive maps and timelines; feudalism in the digital representation; learning about everyday life in the Middle Ages through digital illustrations, quizzes and games; medieval warfare through digital simulations; teaching the problems of the nobility by making coats of arms; the Middle Ages in modern literature; film as a source for teaching history
- tools are not exclusive to content

Lessons learnt (success factors/mistakes to avoid)



- ability to adapt teaching content
- deviating from exclusively frontal teaching method
- greater involvement of students in the teaching process
- make teaching as interesting as possible
- lack of computer, IT skills
- overutilization of digital media

Adaptability, transferability to other disciplines



- by implementing digital tools and platforms to (history) teaching material it demonstrates how easy learning outcomes can be achieved while also promoting critical thinking and analysing and interpreting (historical) data
- the course can be adopted in other institutions and research fields other then humanities
- one of the courses the University of Rijeka with the aim of dissemination of knowledge, practices and skills and international cooperation
