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


English as a Medium of Instruction (EMI) project

- A project aimed at supporting internationalisation in Serbia by tackling the need
 variable for more university courses provided in foreign languages (primarily English) by
 reinforcing the knowledge and skills of university teachers to teach their subjects in
 English.
- The main activity is the EMI course for university teachers of all fields held at four biggest state universities of Serbia: University of Belgrade, University of Novi Sad, University of Niš and University of Kragujevac.
- The project is first implemented in 2019 and since then four project cycles were carried out all managed by the Foundation Tempus in cooperation with universities, and directly supported by the Ministry of Education (the first cycle in 2019/20, within the initiative *Study in Serbia*) and the Embassy of the United States of America in Serbia (three cycles in 2021/22, 2022/23 and 2023/24).




EMI course:

Trainers and outcomes for trainees

Led by EMI professionals, additionally trained in the field

- Pool of expert language instructors from each
 university participating in the project
- Additional training on EMI topics in the first two cycles of the project (2019 and 2021), led by worldwide EMI experts – Prof. Ernesto Macaro and Prof. Mark Searle (University of Oxford), Prof. Mary Page (University of Southampton) and Prof. Julianne Hammink (University of Arizona).
- Syllabi of the EMI course were jointly designed and developed in those trainings and later implemented in similar ways and with equal outcomes at all four universities.









EMI course: Timeline overview

Testing of the English language level (B2) and forming the groups

Certificate award to the participants who successfully passed the course

September

A public call for university teachers is published with all requirements and procedures

October — November-March -

March

Course implementation: 12 theoretical and 3 practical 90 minutes long sessions









EMI course: structure and topics

12 theoretical and 3 practical 90-minute sessions delivered in groups

Topics of the theoretical sessions:

- focus on language (vocabulary filed specific, academic, general; structure, register, functional vs. content language, coherence and cohesion etc);
- focus on teaching (effective lecturing, planning, structuring and delivering the lecture, interaction with students, tools and visuals, technology and online resources etc.

- Practical (microteaching) sessions:
 15-minute field specific lecture
 with feedback (teacher and peer
 assessment)
- Possibility of self-reflection and assessment (recorded practical sessions)
- Additional value: sharing experience and good practice in internationalisation among teachers from different faculties







EMI projects: results and outcomes



- **611 university teachers** from diverse academic fields completed the course so far
- Recognition and applicability: the EMI certificate is listed in some of the university procedures for professional advancement and/or supporting document in Erasmus+ calls
- Contribution to academic offer: increased number of Erasmus+ courses available and study programmes accredited in English at four universities



Promotion and facilitation of institutional cooperation by representing Serbian higher education and institutions in relevant international events (EIAE, NAFSA, NET24, CACIE)


Elaboration and publication of information materials, such as yearly catalogue of accredited study programmes in English in Serbia and the database of education possibilities in Serbia


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
